I. Principal check-in:
a. Mrs. Hart: Kindergarten orientation went well. AIM's web testing in 3 weeks. Mrs. Hart is challenging the students to read 100,000 minutes, the students voted for Ms. Hart to have " $a$ day on the roof" on June $20^{\text {th }}$. She's going to ask the Nedrow Fire Department to put her up in the bucket. Math Literacy Night had a small turnout due to nice weather. Event after event until the end!
b. Mr. Smith: Wheeler finished the Math testing and makeups, the number of students who opted out was about the same. $4^{\text {th }}$ Grade Science testing will begin on May $22^{\text {nd }}$. Rockwell received their "Thanks A Latte" gift cards today. Tomorrow Lindsey will bring food for Rockwell and on Friday she will deliver the "Thanks A Latte" gift cards to Wheeler.
- Derby Day Reading Challenge: Mrs. Kissane compiled all the minutes today. c. June:

VII. Open Forum:
> Wheeler Playground: Follow up with Mr. Price on the remodeling of Wheeler Playground. The PTO wants to create a Playground Committee that will work together to raise funds for age appropriate playground equipment. Mr. Price will reach out to Assemblywoman Hunter to see if there are extra funds left from the Rockwell Outdoor Classroom. Toni can create a google form that will allow teachers and students to vote on playground equipment options. We can reach out to David Muir or Latavius Murray and see if they want to donate or set up a district event to raise funds for the playground.
$>$ District Calendar: PTO will add PTO events to the district calendar - turn in information for the district calendar before June $7^{\text {th }}$. No fundraisers allowed in the calendar.
$>$ District Budget \& Tax Levy: Rob Price and Jennifer Woody informed the PTO of the 2019-2020 district budget and tax levy that will be voted on May $21^{\text {st }}$. The power point presentation highlighted each school and their accomplishments. The main goal of the 1.95 million increase in taxes will be composed of:
$\checkmark$ School Buses (purchasing 3 new buses \& maintaining existing buses)
$\checkmark$ Providing support for the ENL's and Alternative Education Programs
$\checkmark$ State/Mandates
$\checkmark$ Maintenance on the buildings and equipment
$\checkmark$ Annual Computer Replacement Program
$\checkmark$ Maintaining the STAR rebate for homeowners.
